- **Visa and Travel Documents:** Secure work visas for non-UAE nationals (up to 90 days, extendable); include passport copies, flight details, and health insurance.
- **Notify Changes:** Inform ADFC of any alterations (e.g., budget variances over 20%, script changes) to maintain compliance.
- **Final Submission:** For rebates, include audited statements and sworn declarations within 180 days of completion.

2. Cargo Permissions and Imports

3. Rebates and Incentives

Abu Dhabi's rebate scheme offers 35%+ cashback on qualified Abu Dhabi Production Expenditure (ADQPE) effective January 1, 2025. Base rebate 10-25%; up to 50% with points for cultural/sustainability factors. Minimum ADQPE varies by project type (e.g., AED 734,500 for features). Apply at least 30 days before principal photography.

- **Non-Qualifying Expenditures:** Above-the-line fees, cast residuals, financing costs, marketing, capital goods, VAT, cash payments without docs, non-Abu Dhabi visas.
- **Points System for Enhanced Rebate:** Earn extras for cultural representation, sustainability, local talent use, regional spend; features gain for longer filming (up to 60 points).
- **Final Submission (within 180 days of completion):** Audited Expenditure Statement with Auditor's Working Sheet (ADFC-approved auditor), sample footage/rushes, first fine cut, sworn statements from applicant/producer (certified by lawyer), any requested docs.
- **Assessment and Payment:** ADFC reviews in 60 business days; issues Final Certificate in 15 days; payment within 30 days to Abu Dhabi-registered applicant.
- **Notify Changes:** Report budget variances +/-20% or AED 1,000,000, personnel/ locations/schedule/script alterations to ADFC.
